Visitors are invited to either "browse" at their leisure or book one of the spoken tours (about 20mins) to learn about the rich history, quirky stories and international connections of the chapel. A quiz and wordsearch will be available for younger visitors and those wishing to learn in a fun way about the many influential itinerant preachers, architecture and Methodism in general. Also, this year, look out for the new family of "*Pentre Llifior Dragons*" who have interesting facts to tell about the building and its contents.

Entry to the event is free but drinks and light refreshments will be available throughout the opening hours in the stable opposite the chapel. 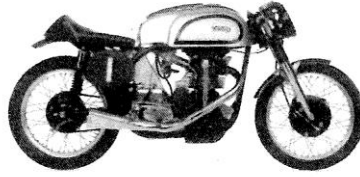

RECIPE

OATY APPLE CRUMBLE – Serves 4. Cook 180°C / 160°C Fan / Gas 4.

3 Bramley apples and 3 eating apples
peeled, cored and cut into chunks
40g caster sugar
50g sultanas
50g soft light brown sugar
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

25g honey
125g butter
150g oats
150g plain flour
50g flaked almonds

Cook the apples with the caster sugar – add a splash of water if they start to stick to the pan. When tender and a bit saucy stir in the sultanas and tip into an ovenproof dish. Melt the brown sugar, honey and butter in a pan. Remove from the heat and stir in the oats, flour, almonds and cinnamon. Mix until sticky and crumbly. Spread the mix over the apples. Bake for 40 – 50 minutes until the topping is golden and crisp. Serve warm with custard, ice-cream or cream.

Powis Facts:

- Powis Castle began life as the medieval fortress of the Welsh princes of Powys, who held onto their kingdom despite the threats of their more powerful neighbours in Gwynedd and England.
- In 1587, Powis was sold to Sir Edward Herbert who created the romantic long gallery which is richly decorated with the coats of arms of his ancestors.
- The first Marquess of Powis was forced into exile in 1668 due to his loyalty to the deposed King James II.
- In 1784, the marriage of Lady Henrietta Herbert and Edward Clive, son of Robert Clive, the conqueror of India, combined the Powis and Clive estates.
- In the early 20th Century, the 4th Earl of Powis and his wife, Lady Violet, redecorated much of the castle and brought the garden back to life, introducing new varieties from all over the world.
