

RECIPE

Cheese and Onion Jacks.

1 small onion, chopped 3oz. butter or hard margarine 8oz. mature cheddar cheese, grated 7oz. oats 2 eggs, beaten ½ tsp. dry mustard pinch of dried rosemary pinch of paprika salt and pepper

- 1. Heat the oven to 180c, 160c fan, 350F, Gas mark 4.
- 2. Gently fry the onion in the butter or margarine for about 5 minutes, until soft.
- 3. Add the remaining ingredients to the onion and mix well, adding salt and pepper to taste.
- 4. Turn into a greased swiss roll tin and smooth the top.
- 5. Bake for 35 minutes or until golden brown.
- 6. Cut into wedges and serve warm or cold.
