## **RECIPE**

### **Cheese and Onion Jacks.**

1 small onion, chopped	½ tsp. dry mustard
3oz. butter or hard margarine	pinch of dried rosemary
8oz. mature cheddar cheese, grated	pinch of paprika
7oz. oats	salt and pepper
2 eggs, beaten	

1. Heat the oven to 180c, 160c fan, 350F, Gas mark 4.
2. Gently fry the onion in the butter or margarine for about 5 minutes, until soft.
3. Add the remaining ingredients to the onion and mix well, adding salt and pepper to taste.
4. Turn into a greased swiss roll tin and smooth the top.
5. Bake for 35 minutes or until golden brown.
6. Cut into wedges and serve warm or cold.
